## PRECAUTIONS

Always follow the basic precautions listed below to avoid the possibility of serious injury or even death from electrical shock, short-circuiting, damages, fire or other hazards. These precautions include, but are not limited to, the following:

#### Power supply

- Do not place the power cord near heat sources such as heaters or radiators. Also, do not excessively bend or otherwise damage the cord, or place heavy objects on it.
- Do not touch the product or the power plug during an electrical storm.
- Only use the correct voltage specified for the product. The required voltage is printed on the name plate of the product.
- Use the specified AC adaptor (page 20).
- Check the power plug periodically and remove any dirt or dust which may have accumulated on it.
- Insert the power plug firmly all the way into the AC outlet. Using the product when it is not plugged in sufficiently can cause dust to accumulate on the plug, possibly resulting in fire or skin burns.
- When setting up the product, make sure that the AC outlet you are using is easily accessible. • Unlike an acoustic piano, this instrument does not need to be tuned by an expert (although the pitch can be useradjusted to match other instruments). This is because the pitch of digital instruments is always maintained perfectly.

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#### When Moving/Installing the Instrument

When moving the instrument after assembly (page 16), be sure to keep the instrument horizontal and hold with two or more people. Do not subject the instrument to excessive vibration or shock. After re-installation, check the assembly checklist. If you move to another location, you can transport the instrument along with other belongings. The unit can be transported either assembled or disassembled.

We recommend that you place the instrument away from the wall by about 5 cm to optimize and enhance the overall sound even further.

   For adjusting the volume of the entire sound.

 [GRAND PIANO/FUNCTION] button .. page 12 For instantly calling up the Grand Piano 1 Voice.

#### FUNCTION

You can set various parameters by pressing a note on the keyboard while holding this button.

#### [PHONES] jacks

For connecting a set of standard stereo headphones.

#### **A**CAUTION

Do not use headphones at a high volume for an extended period of time; doing so may cause hearing loss.

- **(** [TO PEDAL] jack ...... page 18 For connecting the pedal cord.

- Soft Pedal (Left) ...... page 14 Pressing this pedal reduces the volume and slightly changes the timbre of notes.
- Sostenuto Pedal (Center) ...... page 14 Pressing this pedal after playing a note or notes (but before releasing your fingers) causes the pressed note(s) to sustain while subsequent notes can be played without sustain.
- **O** Damper Pedal (Right)..... page 14 Pressing this pedal causes the notes you play to have a longer sustain. It can be used with the half pedal function.

## Setting Up

#### **Key Cover**

To open the key cover, lift the cover slightly, then push and slide it to the end.

To close the key cover, gently slide the cover toward you.



#### A CAUTION

Hold the cover with both hands when opening or closing it. Do not release it until it is fully opened or closed. Be careful to avoid catching fingers (yours or others, especially children's) between the cover and main unit.

#### **Turning the Power On**

1. Connect the plugs of the AC adaptor in the order shown in the illustration.



Follow the order shown above in reverse when disconnecting the AC adaptor.

#### 🗥 WARNING

- Use the specified adaptor (page 20) only. The use of other adaptors may result in irreparable damage to both the adaptor and the instrument.
- When setting up the product, make sure that the AC outlet you are using is easily accessible. If some trouble or malfunction occurs, immediately turn the power off and disconnect the plug from the outlet.
- When using the AC adaptor with a removable plug,
  Make sure to keep the plug attached to the AC adaptor. Using the plug alone can cause electric shock or fire.
- If the plug is accidentally removed from the AC adaptor, never touch the metallic section when attaching the plug. To avoid electric shock, short circuit or damage, also be careful that there is no dust between the AC adaptor and plug.



The shape of the plug and outlet differ depending on the locale.

- 2. Turn down the [MASTER VOLUME] knob to "MIN."
- 3. Press the [O] (Standby/On) switch to turn the power on.

Adjust the volume as desired while playing the keyboard.



#### NOTICE

Press only the  $[\Phi]$  (Standby/On) switch when turning the power on. Any other operations, such as pressing the keys, buttons or pedals may cause the instrument to malfunction.

 Press the [𝔄] (Standby/On) switch again for 1 second to turn off the power.

The power lamp turns off.

#### **CAUTION**

Even when the  $[\Phi]$  (Standby/On) switch is in the standby status, electricity is still flowing to the instrument at a minimum level. When not using the instrument for an extended period of time, be sure to unplug the power cord from the wall AC outlet.

#### **Auto Power Off Function**

To prevent unnecessary power consumption, this function automatically turns the power off if the instrument is not operated for 30 minutes.

Default setting: Enabled

#### **Disabling Auto Power Off (simple method)**

While holding down the A–1 key (the lowest key), press the  $[\Phi]$  (Standby/On) switch to turn the instrument on.



To re-enable the Auto Power Off function, see page 12 (2).

#### **Volume Limiter Function**

When this function is on, the Master Volume does not increase even when the [MASTER VOLUME] knob is turned to the right from center. This allows you to protect your hearing when using the headphones or prevent loud sound from coming out of the speakers.

To turn on this function, see page 13 (1).



Maximum Volume (Center) The Master Volume does not increase even when the [MASTER VOLUME] knob is turned to the right from center.

## Functions

You can call up a function by holding down the [GRAND PIANO / FUNCTION] button and pressing the specified key. For certain functions, changing the setting produces a confirmation sound. Simply pressing the [GRAND PIANO / FUNCTION] button calls up the Grand Piano 1 Voice.

#### Using the Pedals

#### Damper Pedal (Right)

Pressing this pedal will sustain notes longer. Releasing this pedal immediately stops (damps) any sustained notes. This pedal also features a "half-pedal" function that creates partial sustain effects, depending on how far down you press the pedal.



When you press the damper pedal here, this note and the notes you play before you release the pedal sustain longer.

#### NOTE

If the damper pedal doesn't work, make sure that the pedal cord is properly plugged into the main unit (page 18).

#### Half-pedal function

This function allows you to vary the sustain length depending on how far the pedal is pressed. The farther down you press the pedal, the more the sound sustains. For example, if you press the damper pedal and all notes you are playing sound a bit murky and loud with too much sustain, you can release the pedal half way or higher to decrease the sustain (murkiness).

#### **Damper Resonance**

When only piano Voices (page 15) is selected, pressing the damper pedal activates the Damper Resonance effect (page 12) to recreate the resonance of an acoustic piano's strings.

#### NOTE

Damper Resonance cannot be used in Duo.

#### Sostenuto Pedal (Center)

Pressing this pedal while holding the notes will sustain the pressed notes (as if the Damper Pedal had been pressed), but all subsequently played notes will not be sustained. This makes it possible to sustain a chord or single low note, for example, while the other notes are played "staccato."



When you press the sostenuto pedal here while holding the note, the note will sustain as long as you hold the pedal.

#### NOTE

While the sostenuto pedal is held, the organ and strings Voices sound continuously without decay after the notes have been released.

#### Soft Pedal (Left)

Pressing this pedal will reduce the volume and slightly change the timbre of the notes. The notes played before this pedal is pressed are not affected.

#### Pedal function in Duo (page 12)

In Duo, the pedal function changes as follows.

- **Right Pedal:** Damper pedal for the right-hand range.
- Center Pedal: Damper pedal for both the righthand and left-hand ranges.
- Left Pedal: Damper pedal for the left-hand range.

- · Assemble the instrument using at least two people.
- Assemble the instrument on a hard and flat floor with ample space.
- Be sure to use the correct parts in the correct orientation, and assemble the instrument in accordance with the sequence given here.
- Keep small parts (such as screws) out of the reach of infants. Children may accidentally swallow them.
- Be sure to use only the included screws of specified sizes. Use of any other screws can cause damage or malfunction of the product.
- To disassemble the unit, reverse the assembly sequence given here.

Have a Phillips-head (+) screwdriver of the appropriate size ready.

#### Post-assembly checklist

- There are no unused parts.
- The instrument is stable even if you shake it.
- The pedal adjuster is firmly pressed against to the floor surface.
- Both the pedal cord and power cord are plugged securely into the correct jacks.
- → If there are any items above you haven't confirmed, review the assembly procedure and correct any errors.

#### NOTICE

Make sure to place the main unit on the polystyrene foam pads that have been removed from the packages. Position the pads so that they will not contact the speaker covers on the bottom of the main unit.



\* The adaptor may not be included, or may look different from the illustration above, depending on your particular area.

1. Align the side boards with each end of pedal box, and lightly tighten with flat head screws (6 × 20 mm) for temporary fastening

These screws will be tightened securely later in step 3.



#### 2. Attach the back board.

Depending on the model, the surface color of one side of the back board may be different from the other side. In this case, position the back board so that the side facing the front (pedal side) matches the color of the main unit.



- 2-1 Place the back board on each foot of side boards.
- 2-2 Attach the top of the back board by temporarily fastening the thin screws (4 × 12 mm).
- 2-3 While pushing on the lower part of the side boards from the outside, secure the bottom ends of the back board using tapping screws  $(4 \times 20 \text{ mm})$  in the order from outside to inside ( $\mathbf{0} \rightarrow \mathbf{2}$ ).

2-4 Securely tighten the screws on the top of the back board that were attached in step 2-2.

#### 3. Secure the pedal box.

Securely tighten the screws on the pedal box that were attached in step 1.



#### 4. Set the main unit in place.



- 4-1 Be sure to hold the bottom surface at least 10 cm inside from the edge of the main unit so that you do not pinch your hands.
- 4-2 Place the main unit on the side boards so that the front of the main unit and the side boards are aligned. Slide the main unit forward and insert the metal fittings on the bottom of the main unit into the metal fittings on the side boards.

#### 

- Be careful not to pinch your hands or drop the main unit.
- Do not hold anywhere other than the specified position.

5. Secure the main unit by tightening the thick screws ( $6 \times 16$  mm).



6. Connect the pedal cord plug and the power plug.



6-1 Insert the pedal cord plug to the [TO PEDAL] jack from the rear.

Insert the plug until the metal part disappears from view.



#### NOTICE

If it is not plugged in firmly, it may cause the pedals to not work.

6-2 Wind the cord holders around pedal cord to hold it.

The cord holders are attached to the side board (L).

6-3 Insert the DC plug into the DC IN jack.



7. Rotate the adjuster until it presses in firm contact with the floor surface.

Make sure that the pedal box does not rattle or give way when you step on the pedals.



After completing the assembly, please check the Postassembly checklist (page 16).

## Data Backup and Initializing

The following data will automatically be maintained as backup data even if you turn off the power.

#### Backup data

#### To initialize the backup data:

While holding down the C7 key (right-most key), turn the power on to initialize the backup data to the factory initial settings.

The overall volume is low, or no sound is heard.	Make sure a pair of headphones or conversion adaptor is not connected to the [PHONES] jack (page 9).
