

Read Instructions—All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.

2

Retain Instructions—The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3

Heed Warnings—All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4

Follow Instructions—All operating and other instructions should be followed.

5

Water and Moisture—The appliance should not be used near water—for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.

6

Carts and Stands—The appliance should be used only with a cart or stand that is recommended by the manufacturer.

7

Wall or Ceiling Mounting—The appliance should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.

Ventilation—The appliance should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. Power Sources—The appliance should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.

Power-Cord Protection—Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items—placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plags, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.

Cleaning—The appliance should be cleaned only as recommended by the manufacturer.

Nonuse periods—The power cord of the appliance should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time.

Object and Liquid Entry—Care should be taken so that objects do not fall into and liquids are not spilled into the inside of the appliance.

Damage Requiring Service—The appliance should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:

- A. The power-supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
- B. Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the appliance; or
- C. The appliance has been exposed to rain; or
- D. The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
- E. The appliance has been dropped, or the cabinet damaged.

Servicing—The user should not attempt to service the appliance beyond those means described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.





• Explanation of Graphic Symbols

CAUTION: READ THIS BEFORE OPERATING YOUR B-2x

To ensure the finest performance, please read this manual carefully. Keep it in a safe place for future reference.

2

Install your B-2x in a cool, dry, clean place—away from windows, heat sources, and too much vibration, dust, moisture or cold. Avoid sources of hum (transformers, motors). To prevent fire or electrical shock, do not expose to rain and water.

3

Do not operate the amplifier upside-down. It may overheat, possibly causing damage.

4

Never open the cabinet. If a foreign object drops into the set, contact your dealer.

5

Do not place records or other objects on top of the amplifier; this will block the ventilation holes, cause the internal temperature to rise and may result in a failure.

6

Do not use force on switches, knobs or cords. When moving the set, first turn the B-2x off. Then gently disconnect the power plug and the cords connecting to other equipment. Never yank the cords.

7

Do not attempt to clean the B-2x with chemical solvents, this might damage the finish. Use a clean, dry cloth.

8

Be sure to read the "troubleshooting" section on common operating errors before concluding that your B-2x is faulty.


Do not connect audio equipment to the AC outlet on the rear panel if that equipment requires more power than the outlet.



Check that the voltage selector is set to your local voltage before you plug it in. If not properly set, reset the switch to indicate your supply voltage (100-120/220-240 V).

CONNECTIONS

MICONNECTING A CONTROL AMP

Connect the output of the control amplifier to the input phono receptors on the rear panel of the B-2x. The phono-plug pins on both ends of the connecting cords should be clean.

Connect firmly and securely. Make sure that both the control amplifier and the B-2x are properly grounded. Always turn off the power switches of both units when connecting or disconnecting the power and control amplifier.

mCONNECTION OF POWER SUPPLY

- As the rated power consumption of the B-2x is 470 watts, do not connect it to the outlet (spare AC power outlet) of another amplifier.
- * Regardless of the position (ON/OFF) of the power switch of the B-2x, the AC OUTLET (spare AC power outlet) provided on the rear panel will handle a maximum of 300 watts power consumpsion when a power cord is inserted in it.

CAUTION

DO NOT CONNECT THIS AMPLIFIER TO AN AMPLIFIER/SPEAKER SWITCHING SYSTEM. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CONFIRM PERFORMANCE WITH A COMBINATION/COMMON GROUND AUDIO OSCILLATOR AND T.H. D./I.M. ANALYZER SYSTEM. DO NOT CONNECT AN OUTPUT POWER METER.


THE RED (+) AND BLACK (-) SPEAKER TERMINALS ARE INTERNALLY CONNECTED TO ACTIVE CIRCUITRY (NOT TO CHASSIS OF COMMON GROUND).

■CONNECTING AND OPERATION OF SPEAKER SYSTEM

Connect a speaker system having an impedance of 4 ohms to 16 ohms to the A or B side of SPEAKERS (speaker output terminals) provided on the rear panel. When using A and B speaker output terminals at the same time, check and confirm that all the polarities (+ & -) are correct, and right and left speakers are connected to right and left terminals. Otherwise, unnatural sound with poor bass response will be produced.

BIGND (Ground Terminal)


If hum or noise occurs during operation, try grounding the amplifier or connecting this terminal to the Ground terminal of the control amp.



MHOW TO USE LEVEL CONTROLS


The right side of the Level control provided on the rear panel is for the L (left) channel, while the left one is for the R (right) channel. If the sound distorts appreciably when a high output control amplifier is connected, lower the input level by turning these Level controls counterclockwise.

Volume adjustment of the control amplifier can be facilitated by turning the set's Level control counterclockwise a little. But if turned fully counterclockwise no sound will be produced.





NAMES OF THE PARTS AND THEIR FUNCTIONS



POWER switch

When this button is depressed, power will be switched on and the red indicator will illuminate. When depressed again, power will turn off and the indicator will go out.

- No sound will be heard for several seconds following depression of this switch because of the action of the muting relay that works to eliminate the pop-noise caused by switchon of power.
- * Be sure to turn the Volume control of the control amplifier to the minimum position (turned fully counterclockwise) when turning on the POWER switch, to prevent extremely high sound levels which could damage the speakers.

PROTECTION indicator

After the Power Switch is turned on, the Protection Indicator will light to inform you that the B-2x's protection circuitry is operating. While this indicator is lit, output signal to the speakers is muted. The protection circuitry normally operates for several seconds after power is switched on, and ceases operation when the indicator is no longer lit.


 During operation of the B-2x, should the Protection Indicator light and output signal be muted, disconnect the plug from the AC outlet at once and locate the cause.

SPEAKERS switches

With these switches, you can select A, B or both of two sets of speakers. When button A is depressed, it will cause the speaker circuit that is connected to the A-side of the rear panel to turn on. When button B is depressed, it will cause the speaker circuit connected to the B-side of the rear panel to turn on. Depressing buttons A and B for the second time will cause the speaker circuits to be disconnected.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Before assuming that the amplifier is faulty, check the following troubleshooting list which details the corrective action you can take yourself without having to call a service engineer. If you have any doubts or questions, get in touch with your nearest Yamaha dealer.
